**First attendance:** After resuming its legal status in the International Olympic Committee in 1979, China participated in the Winter Games in 1980 for the first time.

Chinese athlete Li Yan captured a gold in women's 1,000m Short-Track Speed Skating Performance and two bronzes in 500m and 1,500m Speed Skating Performance.



**First medal:** Chinese skater Ye Qiaobo (left) captured silver medals in 500m and 1,000m Speed Skating despite her injuries in 1992.

**First gold:** Yang Yang won the first gold medal of the Olympic Winter Games for China in women's 500m Short Track Speed Skating.



Wang Meng captured three golds in women's 500m, 1,000m Short-track Speeding Skating and Relay. She also broke the world record.



Wu Dajing won China's first gold medal in a men's individual ice sport.
